

Their travels provide material for the many Talks they give around the UK. These talks include the Antarctic, the Arctic, India, Kenya and Namibia. Judges' Comments:

We so much enjoyed seeing the very wide range of entries and categories. Selection was difficult: we frequently struggled to finalise the winning entries from a very large "short list" of our favourite images. The most demanding of all was the Nature/Wildlife sections where we could easily have doubled both the prints and DPI winners, if the rules had allowed us. We judge a lot of exhibitions: it was noticeable that refreshingly, a large proportion of entries were very original, avoiding the usual workshops and set ups. Although the results of workshops are often very good, when we are presented with these we have difficulty deciding how much the photographer has contributed - so we were delighted to see so much originality from the members: congratulations to you all. Many thanks must go to Clair and James for their hospitality and to all the committee members for creating a relaxed atmosphere and for the superb lunch (including the amazing pavlova!), to enable us to concentrate on the DPIs and Prints.

About Cheltenham Camera Club

Cheltenham Camera Club is the 6th oldest photographic club in the UK. It was started on 4th January, 1865 by Dr Edward Thomas Wilson, father of EA Wilson the explorer, and Dr Abercrombie, a colleague at the Cheltenham General Hospital. Edward learnt his photography as a boy from his uncle, Francis Frith, whose nineteenth century photographs are still widely published today. With Abercrombie, he was one of the early pioneers of photomicrography, and the photographing of landscapes and portraits using the early dry plate process.

By the 1890s the club had over 60 members. Members enthusiastically shared photographic techniques, went on photographic outings and held exhibitions of their work. Eminent photographers over the years have included Hugo van Wadenoyen FRPS, a very prolific national exhibitor and author of many books on photographic techniques, and Eric Franks ARPS who recorded the town during the post war period.

At the Club's first exhibition in 1896 a staggering total of 900 images were displayed. That enthusiasm and ethos is still very much in evidence at the club. Today, CCC has over a hundred members and organises not only this exhibition, but also the internationally acclaimed **Cheltenham International Salon of Photography** which often receives over 8000 images from around the world, and the annual **Gloucestershire Young Photographer of the Year Award** competition which showcases photographs taken by pupils from Primary and Secondary Schools across the County, last year attracting 800 entries from 32 schools. This competition will be finalised later in the Spring. We have been grateful to Cheltenham Arts Council and the University of Gloucestershire for their sponsorship.

If you are interested in photography, then why not join CCC? We have talks, competitions and special interest groups covering all aspects of photography in a friendly and supportive environment.
