

In addition to judging he is also heavily involved in the exhibition side of photography being the current Chair of the Bristol Salon, Exhibition Secretary for the RPS Nature Group, and running the Western Counties Federations Inter Club Championships. Ralph with his wife Margaret regularly travel in search of new photographic opportunities. Concentrating mainly on Wildlife and Nature this has taken them amongst others to both top and bottom of the globe as well as many destinations in Africa and South America Ralph is member of Bristol Photographic where he is the current Chairman. Judge's Comments: The first thing to say is to thank James and his team for the excellent manner in which the exhibition judging was organised. It was a pleasure to be in such a comfortable, relaxed, and friendly atmosphere, with an excellent lunch, plenty of Coffee. If only all judging could be like this

The splitting of the entries into a wide range of categories worked very well, ensuring that the assessment allowed judging to be done 'like for like', minimising the need to compare such different genres such as Portraits, Nature and Creative.

The standard in each section was good and deciding on the top images in each class was always a difficult task, this was particularly true in the print sections. Overall the technical aspects of images was first class with little in the way of over processing and sharpening. While this was good to see, it made it even more difficult to choose 'the best' images. There was also not much in the way of the same subject appearing repeatedly so producing a wide range of subject matter. A very enjoyable day: well done to all who entered and made it a difficult job to identify the final awarded images.

About Cheltenham Camera Club

Cheltenham Camera Club is the 6th oldest photographic club in the UK. It was started on 4th January, 1865 by Dr Edward Thomas Wilson, father of EA Wilson the explorer, and Dr John Abercrombie, a colleague at the Cheltenham General Hospital. Edward learnt his photography as a boy from his uncle, Francis Frith, whose nineteenth century photographs are still widely published today. With Abercrombie, he was one of the early pioneers of photomicrography, and the photographing of landscapes and portraits using the early dry plate process.

By the 1890s the club had over 60 members. Members enthusiastically shared photographic techniques, went on photographic outings and held exhibitions of their work. Eminent photographers over the years have included Hugo van Wadenoyen FRPS, a very prolific national exhibitor and author of many books on photographic techniques, and Eric Franks ARPS who recorded the town during the post war period.

At the Club's first exhibition in 1896 a staggering total of 900 images were displayed. That enthusiasm and ethos is still very much in evidence at the club. Today, CCC has over a hundred members and organises not only this exhibition, but also the internationally acclaimed **Cheltenham International Salon of Photography** which often receives over 8000 images from around the world, and the annual **Gloucestershire Young Photographer of the Year Award** competition which showcases photographs taken by pupils from Primary and Secondary Schools across the County, this year attracting 1115 entries from 68 schools. This competition will be finalised later in the Spring. We have been grateful to Cheltenham Arts Council and the University of Gloucestershire for their sponsorship.

If you are interested in photography, then why not join CCC? We have talks, competitions and special interest groups covering all aspects of photography in a friendly and supportive environment.

Cheltenham Camera Club meets weekly at 7.30 on Thursday evenings, from September to May at Holy Apostles Church Hall, London Road, Charlton Kings, Cheltenham GL52 6HW
